News of the Week

As part of helping students to #DoYourBest we strive to build a sense of belonging and community belonging among our students, staff and families. This Friday at parade our school community will celebrate the induction of the 2025 Student Leaders. We are also working on streamlining the enrolment process for our existing school families and request return of this information by the end of this term.

Home- School Partnerships

This Thursday the School Council will meet to look at the 2025 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP). AIPs are used by state schools to identify particular focus areas for improvement each year. The focus may come from an internal or external context. The 2025 improvement areas are:

- 1. The implementation of version 9 of the Australian Curriculum in English and Maths
- 2. Further development of school-wide teaching concepts of students social-emotional learning.

The social emotional learning in state schools is drawn from the General Capabilities of the <u>Australian Curriculum</u>. Personal and <u>Social Competencies (see more here)</u>

They are embedded in school subjects are also taught through the explicit teaching of expected behaviours related to learning and being part of larger social groups.

MONEY COMING TO SCHOOL

Would parents please ensure that any money sent to school for any purposes other than tuckshop is sent **directly to the office** and is placed in an envelope with student's name, grade and particular item or excursion they are paying for, clearly marked on the front of envelope. Pre-printed envelopes are available



at the office for any payments. Parents that prefer to deposit the funds directly into the school bank account are requested to advise the office of the deposit and to use the student surname and invoice number as the payment reference. As large amounts of money pass through the school office it becomes difficult and time consuming to identify payments without this information.

You should now be receiving all your child's invoices via email. If you need to provide the office with an updated email address, please do so as soon as possible, as some school notes and information will also be sent via email.

ABSENCES

Please Phone 4120 8066 and leave a message on the Absence Line in the event of a student being absent. Please phone each day your child is absent from school unless the office has been previously advised of the absence. Verbal messages by the student are not sufficient. This prevents any misunderstanding and ensures the safety of your child. Please note that, by law, we are required to report any long term unexplained absences from school which may then be investigated by the police.

LATE ARRIVAL

The school day begins at 8:45am and all staff will begin instruction at this time. Arrivals after 8:45am are considered to be late. Late arrival should be accompanied by a note but parents may ring the office with this information. Students must first report to the office to obtain a late slip that is to be given to their teacher.

EARLY ARRIVALS

Please be aware that there are **NO** staff members on duty before 8 am. We have more students arriving before this time. If there is a legitimate reason for students to be at school before 8am, then contact the office to make arrangements. These students must then follow the rules by sitting quietly at the far end of the Administration Building.

SMS NOTIFICATION

The school is now utilising an SMS system to notify parents of any unexplained absence. If you receive a text message stating your child's absence is unexplained, you can reply via text, stating your child's name, and reason for absence. If you believe your child should be present at school, please phone the office immediately on 4120 8000.

EARLY DEPARTURE

Children leaving school early must be picked up from the office. Parents may ring in advance to arrange for their child/ren to be ready for collection, or send a note to the class teacher. Your child will be given an early departure slip from the office. Please minimise disruptions to teaching and learning by organising early departures in advance and for break times.

Student Attendance - Same Day Absence Notification

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for the Department of Education and for the Queensland Government.

At Tinana State School we endeavour to contact a parent or carer via text message when a student's absence is unexplained after the first roll marking of the day.

As home and school work together, student safety will be increased. Here are some guidelines to make this process more efficient:

- Notify the school by phone, QParents or email before 9:00am if your student is going to be absent that day. Please give a brief explanation for the absence.
- If you receive a text message regarding an unexplained absence, please respond promptly, either via text, QParents or phone call.
- Please ensure that your mobile phone number and other contact details are up-to-date on the school records. This is critical, as we need to be able to contact you in case of emergency.
- If your student arrives late to school, they must go to the office for a late pass before going to their classroom. If they are leaving early, a leave pass must be obtained from the office.

Preparing for NAPLAN 2025

Tinana State school is currently preparing for our students in year 3 & 5 to sit the National Assessment Program Literacy & Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests which will be held from 12 March -24 March 2025.

NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine how well young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning, and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN tests are one aspect of each school's assessment and reporting process. NAPLAN does not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance. A child's teacher will have the best insight into the child's educational progress. NAPLAN results do not measure overall school quality.

NAPLAN questions are aligned with the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics. As such, the best preparation students can do for NAPLAN is to learn what they do in the classroom every day. On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for, and students are not expected to do so.

The assessments allow parents to see how their child is progressing against national standards in literacy and numeracy, and over time. Along with other school assessment reports, NAPLAN supports parents in discussing their child's strengths and areas for improvement with teachers.

NAPLAN results can assist teachers by providing additional information to support their professional judgement about students' levels of literacy and numeracy attainment and progress.

NAPLAN can support school improvement by enabling teachers to monitor their students' progress over time against the national

measure, to identify strengths and areas to improve in teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.

Students and parents wishing to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN can visit the public demonstration site on the NAP website. Some

past NAPLAN papers are also available.

- Fruit break


•Preps will then embark on a bear hunt activity with their class in the prep playground

Have you signed up for QParents!?

This is our BEST & PREFERRED communication tool for Permissions, Payments, Reporting and Events! Come into the office from 9am-2:45pm any school day with 100 points of ID to get signed up easily! (Or do it at home on a laptop or computer)! (ID can include any license, any government issued photo ID, Medicare Card, Health Care / Pension Card, Birth Certificate, Passport, Utilities Bills showing your name & address, Centrelink Letter with your name & address). If you have already done a low document application at home, you need to bring your 100 points of ID into the office so we can approve your access.

Have you received your invoice for your SRS (Maths workbook & paper)?

If not, it's because you haven't opted in! You must return the consent form or sign up on QParents!

Your child is required to have the correct Maths workbook.

For children whose parents opted in, your child's book has already been delivered to their class!
