Student Dress Code

Tinana State School is a uniform school with a Student Dress Code endorsed by the school community as represented by the P&C Association.

PURPOSE: Our dress code provides clothing that aims to contribute to a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment through:

- ready identification of students and non-students at school;
- fostering a sense of belonging; and
- developing inclusive, mutual respect among students by minimising visible evidence of economic or social differences.
- promotes an effective teaching and learning environment by eliminating the distraction of competition in dress and fashion at the school

The student dress code reflects school community standards and is consistent with occupational health and safety and anti-discrimination legislation.

Acknowledgement of students demonstrating a high standard of self-responsibility in their dress code occurs through:

- parade acknowledgements.
- Student Council Acknowledgement Certificates for classes.

Inappropriate dress refers to clothing or apparel worn by students that is deemed to be:

- Offensive;
- Likely to disrupt, or negatively influence normal school operations;
- Unsafe for student or others; and
- Likely to result in a risk to health and safety of student or others.

In circumstances where inappropriate or unreasonable dress is worn, a resolution will be discussed with the student and their parent/carer.

UNIFORM



Tinana State School polo style shirt

(Red with Tinana Logo screen printed on breast, black, white and red sleeve and collar trim),



Black Shorts – mid thigh

Black Skort/ Skirt – mid thigh

Socks – short black or white

Shoes – fully enclosed black shoes or joggers.

(NOTE: If children have a foot injury that prevents the wearing of shoes for a short period of time, a note to class teachers is required)

<p>WINTER UNIFORM</p>	<p>As for Summer/Sports uniform. Warm clothing to include black bottoms (e.g. track pants) and either: black or red pullover; or school jacket.</p>	
<p>SPORTS UNIFORM</p>		<p>Sports Houses are Chappell (green), Wickham (blue) and Laver (yellow). Sports Uniform may be worn on designated sports days and when students have physical education lessons scheduled or have athletics events.</p> <p>Tinana Sports Polo (green, blue or yellow with Tinana logo screen printed on breast)</p> <p>Black Shorts – mid thigh</p> <p>Black Skort/ Skirt – mid thigh (Bicycle shorts in black may be worn for sporting events)</p>
<p>MUSIC UNIFORM</p>	<p>Music shirts may be worn on days when students have rehearsal. It is required for performance events. The music department has a stock of loan shirts. The shirt is designed to be worn out.</p>	
<p>OPTIONAL UNIFORM</p>	<p>Year 6 Senior Shirts are worn on designated days. School representative shirts (Tech Team, Chess Team, Sustainability Squad) may be worn on the day the Team meets (weekly or fortnightly) There will be a designated day of the week when Sports Representative shirts (Maryborough District; Wide Bay Region; and Qld School Sport) can be worn. Giving students the opportunity to wear a music uniform or school representative shirt as listed above is an acknowledgement of their extra-curricular efforts. Red uniform shirts are worn when there is a formal event in school or when students are leaving the school (e.g. swimming lessons or excursions. Exception – Music Performances).</p>	
<p>SCHOOL EVENTS</p>	<p>When a student is representing the school at one of the following events, the Tinana State School polo shirt is to be worn with all buttons done up and shirt tucked in.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leading Weekly Parade • Student Leader Induction Parade • Anzac School Service • Town Anzac March • Excursions 	
<p>JEWELLERY & MAKE UP</p>	<p>Due to the range of playtime and sporting activities students are part of and the subsequent risk of injury or lost items, the following expectations are part of the Tinana State School Dress Code.</p> <p>Necklaces: should only be worn if required (e.g. medical, religious) and must be worn under uniform</p> <p>Bracelets: none; watch only (exemption medical).</p> <p>Rings: none</p> <p>Earrings: studs or sleepers, no dangling or sharp protruding earrings</p>	

	<p>Nail polish: clear (no acrylic nails).</p> <p>Makeup: none</p> <p>Students are responsible for any of the following items that their parent/carer has given permission for them to wear.</p> <p>If students are wearing jewelry items that do not meet expectations, they will be given a rule reminder to not wear the item again. If they persist with wearing items contrary to the code parent/carer will be contacted.</p>
HAIR	<p>Hair: Hair should be tidy, safe for playtime and not interfering with learning. It is advised that shoulder-length hair is tied back or plaited.</p> <p>Only natural coloured hair is to be worn at school. The exception being coloured hairspray for interhouse sports events or Dress-Up days (e.g. book week). Coloured hair spray must be applied at home.</p> <p>Hair ribbon or ornaments should match the uniform being worn i.e. school or house colours.</p>
SUN SAFETY	<p>Hats: The Tinana State School bucket hat or a plain black bucket hat (min 65cm) must be worn during outdoor playtime and Physical Education lessons. Prep hats have a red ribbon on the outside band to identify them at playtime.</p> <p>Hats, hoodies, beanies are not worn inside.</p> <p>For Sun Safety reasons caps are not an acceptable alternative and students will be asked to remove them at school. Loan hats are available on a short-term basis.</p> <p>Swim shirt: required for school lessons.</p>
ASSISTANCE	<p>Thanks to kind community donations there is always a supply of second-hand uniforms available through the P&C Uniform shop. For assistance when a loan uniform shirt is required students should see front office staff.</p> <p>The school sometimes receives donations of new black school shoes. Parents/carers are invited to contact the principal or deputy principal to access these.</p>
EXEMPTIONS & ADJUSTMENTS	<p>If a student is not in a uniform for a particular reason (e.g. sandals because of a foot problem) or require a temporary exemption parents/carers are asked to email admin@tinanass.eq.edu.au by 8am and the message will be passed onto the class teacher.</p> <p>If an ongoing exemption or adjustment is required for an aspect of the dress code parents/carers are asked to contact the principal.</p>
